**MAUI AIDS FOUNDATION SELECTED AS THE SECOND-QUARTER BENEFICIARY OF
THE OHANA FUELS "FUEL UP. DO GOOD." PROGRAM**

Maui AIDS Foundation has been selected as the 2021 second-quarter beneficiary of Ohana Fuels' "Fuel Up. Do Good." community giving program. During the months of April through June 2021 a portion of all gasoline sales at Maui 'Ohana Fuels locations will be donated to the organization.

'Ohana Fuels partners with non-profit organizations serving the needs of the local community and donates a portion of the proceeds from every gallon of gasoline purchased at 'Ohana Fuels stations in that community.

Maui AIDS Foundation is the only organization of its kind serving all islands of Maui County. MAF has provided vital services free to the community for 35 years, providing services for at-risk, underinsured and uninsured individuals. MAF provides comprehensive care, promotes prevention of viral spread in a medically underserved community, education to youth and all ages, a safe clinical environment, free clinical testing, medical insurance, food pantry, housing and linkage to medical care and oral health. Along with these services comes a dedicated case management and prevention team to provide support and counseling. As the economy and funding has grown much more challenging, the goal is to never turn community member away. Fuel up. Do good. is an incredible opportunity to provide significant support to the Maui community through these vital MAF services.
