**MAUI AIDS FOUNDATION RECEIVES \$6,000 FROM THE ELIZABETH TAYLOR AIDS FOUNDATION IN PARTNERSHIP WITH MACY'S**

*Wailuku, HI (January 3, 2018)* — Maui AIDS Foundation has been awarded a grant for \$6,000 from The Elizabeth Taylor AIDS Foundation (ETAF) in partnership with Macy's. The grant will be used for HIV education and testing services including activities involving Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP), a once-daily pill approved by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that is more than 90 percent effective in preventing HIV transmission.
